1. 3. **Swachh Bharat Vidya IEC Programmes :** The activity was in collaborate with the Feedback Foundation which is one of the partner of ONGCs Ltd, the programme was to select motivators to visits the schools that the construction of toilets was sponsored by the ONGCs across the country including 893 toilets of Meghalaya. These motivators will then acts as the person who will spread awareness campaign on the operation and maintenance of school toilets and the encourages the children and teachers in the practices of handwashing before and after having food and after using the school toilets



4. **Water Management In schools :** The State in collaboration with the Auroville foundation which is one of the partner of ONGCs Ltd has conducted a workshop on water management in schools and the outcome of the workshop was that the problem of operation and maintenance of sanitation in schools was through rain water harvesting facilities since our state has the records of being the heaviest rainfall in the world so during the rainy season water can be harvested and make used for sanitation purposed and also drinking. The SEMAM (SSA) has further converge with water resource department and PHE department of the state in order that water can be provided to the schools by means of harvesting or others.



5. **Swachh Bharat Pakhwada** is one of the activities implemented at school as part of spreading the message of Swachh Bharat Mission, Swachh Vidyalaya among student, teachers and parents. The activities taken by schools to conducted and organized during 2016-17 is like Sensitization meeting with parents on imparting message of cleanliness and sanitation, Mass Pledge reading, Sensitization by students to their parents and teachers about safe practices in cleanliness and hygiene, cleaning drive etc.

6. Student's ambassadors are those students who are elected in the school as they may deem fit by the teachers with the purpose to perform their duties in making their school environment clean and green. These of selecting student ambassador is to look upon the sanitation and cleanliness of the school. The procedure of selecting the student ambassador is the one who is elder from among the students and who have a capability to handle the duties entrusted to him/ her by the teachers/ school. It was thought that having Student ambassador at school along with the support of the teachers it will help in making the school environment, school compound and school surrounding neat and clean and maintain a habit of cleanliness in the schools.



Swachh Vidhalaya Puraskar: The programme is through online registration by school across the nation that was introduced by the Ministry of Human Resource and Development Government of India where the school could be awarded at the district, State and national level based on the cleanliness, sanitation, operation and maintenance of schools toilets and classroom, practices of hand washing availability of water for sanitation and drinking purposes, etc. The total number of school that registered themselves was 499 numbers, and only 364 numbers were able to do their final submission and out of these 22 numbers of school could be able to score green and blue marks for national level awards.
