# SECTION –II General Condition of Contract (GCC)

#### 1. Introduction

The Meghalaya Residential School Society (MeRSS), Government of Meghalaya, in its effort to augment the education system in the state, invites expressions of interest (EOI) from Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) for the management and administration of residential schools in Meghalaya. These schools aim to provide quality education and holistic development to children, particularly those from marginalized and underserved communities, in a safe and nurturing environment.

#### 2. Location and Scheme Name:

i. **RMSA Girls Hostel** – Ensuring a safe, secure, and conducive living environment for the students.

Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBVs) were sanctioned under the erstwhile Sarva Shikha Abhiyan (SSA) as residential schools at upper primary level for girls belonging to disadvantaged groups such as SC, ST, OBC, Minority and Below Poverty Line (BPL) families. The Girls Hostel Component of erstwhile Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) which was operational till the year 2017-18 provided hostel facility for girl students in the age group of 14-18 years, studying in classes IX to XII and belonging to SC, ST, OBC, Minority communities and Below Poverty Line families.

Under the newly launched Integrated Scheme of School Education-Samagra Shiksha, effective from the year 2018-19, provision has been made to upgrade the existing KGBVs at upper primary level to upto senior secondary level with a capacity of 150-250 girls in convergence with the erstwhile Girls Hostel Scheme. The scheme envisages to provide:

- access and quality education to girls from disadvantaged groups by setting up residential schools from upper primary to senior secondary level
- to ensure smooth transition of girls from elementary to secondary and up to class XII wherever possible by ensuring the facility of at-least one residential school for girls from classes VI-XII in every Educationally Backward Blocks.

In the State of Meghalaya, there are 9 nos of Girls Hostels located in EBB of Songsak, Samanda, in East Garo Hills, Betasing, Zikzak, Dadenngiri, Selsella, Tikrikilla, Dalu in West Garo Hills and Baghmara Block in South Garo Hills. (*Please see Annexures*).

ii. **Model School** – Managing academic programs, extracurricular activities, and overall development of students.

The Government of India with a view to push forward its vision for Universalisation of Secondary Education as envisaged in the National Policy on Education (NPE) 1992 and in order to make secondary education of good quality, accessible and affordable to all young persons, at least one good quality model school in every (**EBB**) **educational backward blocks** of the District was recommended. The proposal for setting up high quality model schools was rolled out in an understanding that the cost is to be shared by the Centre and State in the funding pattern of 90:10 for the special category States. (*Please see Annexures*).

**A)** The Concept: The Model Schools are expected to have infrastructure and facilities of the same standard as in Kendriya Vidyalaya, with stipulations on pupil teacher ratio, ICT usage, holistic educational environment, appropriate curriculum and emphasis on output and outcome.

<sup>\*\*(</sup>Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs) means a <u>block</u>(this is an intermediate geographical cluster between village and a district) where the level of rural female literacy is less than the national average and the gender gap in literacy rate is above the national average. A block has been designated as an EBB on the basis of twin criteria of Female Literacy Rate (FLR) being below the national average of 46.13% and Gender Gap in Literacy being above the national average of 21.59%. This criteria for identifying an EBB has been earmarked by the Registrar General of India and Census Commissioner, India (RGI)).

#### iii. State Residential Schools

The 19 Residentials Schools were conceptualised under SCA and State Fund as a co-educational institutions from classes 1-12

1) Facilities in Residential Schools: Core infrastructure consists of classrooms, staff quarters, students hostels and Science laboratory. Other infrastructure includes sports complex, auditorium, kitchen garden and green area.

# 2) Unit Cost

- Rs. 2.5 crore per school approx. The allotted fund of Rs. 28.00 crore to PWD was earmarked for land development, fencing and phase –I building.

## 2. Objective

The primary objective of this EOI is to identify capable and experienced NGOs that can take on the responsibility of managing residential schools. The selected NGOs will be expected to oversee the administration, academic activities, infrastructure development, and welfare of students in these institutions.

# 3. Scope of Work

The selected NGOs will be required to undertake the following responsibilities:

- **Academic Management**: Ensure the provision of quality education, including curriculum delivery, teaching methodologies, assessment, and remedial measures for students.
- **Infrastructure Management**: Oversee the maintenance and development of school facilities, including classrooms, hostels, sports facilities, dining areas, and sanitation.
- **Student Welfare**: Provide a safe, healthy, and supportive environment for students, including healthcare, counselling, and extra-curricular activities.
- **Teacher Training**: Organize capacity-building and professional development programs for teaching staff.
- **Community Engagement**: Engage with local communities, parents, and stakeholders to ensure the active involvement of the community in school activities and governance.
- **Monitoring and Reporting**: Implement systems for monitoring student performance, teacher effectiveness, and school infrastructure. Provide regular reports to the concerned authorities on progress and outcomes.

# 4. Eligibility Criteria

To qualify for consideration, the NGO must meet the following criteria:

- **Legal Status**: Registered as an NGO under the relevant laws of India (e.g., the Indian Trusts Act, Societies Registration Act, or Section 8 of the Companies Act).
- **Experience**: A minimum of 3 years of experience in managing educational institutions, particularly residential schools, with a proven track record of success.
- Expertise: Demonstrated expertise in areas such as curriculum development, child psychology, student welfare, teacher training, and community outreach.
- **Financial Capacity**: The NGO should be financially stable with the ability to manage and implement large-scale educational projects.
- **Human Resources**: Availability of qualified and experienced staff to manage and operate the schools.

#### 5. Submission Requirements

Interested NGOs are required to submit the following documents as part of their EOI:

- A cover letter expressing interest in the project and outlining the NGO's experience and capacity to manage residential schools.
- A detailed proposal that includes:
  - o Organizational profile, including registration details and history.
  - o Details of previous educational projects undertaken, particularly those related to residential schools.
  - o Approach and methodology for managing the schools.
  - o Proposed plan for student welfare and community engagement.
  - o Detailed budget and financial plan for the proposed project.
- Copies of relevant certificates, such as the NGO registration certificate, audited financial statements for the last 3 years, and any other relevant documents pertaining to previous educational projects alongwith case/impact study.

#### 6. Evaluation Criteria

EOIs will be evaluated based on the following parameters:

- Experience in Educational Management: Proven experience in managing residential schools or similar projects.
- **Proposed Approach**: The quality and feasibility of the proposed approach to managing the schools.
- Financial Health: The financial capacity and sustainability of the NGO.
- Staff Qualifications: The qualifications and experience of the staff proposed for the project.
- **Community and Stakeholder Engagement**: The ability to engage with local communities, parents, and other stakeholders.

## 8. Terms and Conditions.

- The Government of Meghalaya reserves the right to accept or reject any or all EOIs.
- The selected NGOs will enter into a formal Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Government of Meghalaya for the management of the schools.
- NGOs must ensure compliance with all applicable laws, including child protection regulations and educational standards.
- To ensure that the selected organisation should suitably qualified and possesses adequate experience in managing residential schools.
- The MeRSS is expecting a Lease/Rent basis agreement on nominal rates with specification on the duration of the lease, whether it is for a fixed term (e.g., 11 months, 1 year) or month-to-month or whichever applicable under rule.
- **Rent amount and payment terms**: The EoI must state the rent amount, due date, payment method, and any penalties for late payments.
- The EoI shall also specify the 75% mandatory reservation of seats to the under-privilege, SC/ST, OBC, BPL Children residing within the State notified Neighbourhood Norms under the RTE Act 2009.
